

- iv. Newton Williams b 18 July 1824 KY; d 19 June 1850 at 26 y 1d; drowned while at McKindree College, KY and is buried in Williams-Henderson Cemetery
- v. William H. Williams b abt 1826 KY d 1850 of a lung infection also while at McKindree College; buried Williams-Henderson Cemetery, Greenfield
- vi. **Milton W. Williams**² b 29 Oct 1827 d 3 Apr 1898 Citronelle, Mobile, AL; do not know where he is buried; married **Almira Adeline Edwards**

Milton W. Williams² (*William*¹) b 29 Oct 1827 in Winchester, KY; d 3 Apr 1898 Citronelle, Mobile, Alabama. He was listed in the 1880 Greenfield Precinct, Greene Co., IL census taken on 18th Jun as 52 born KY, father & mother b VA, farmer, with wife, Elmira, son Albert N., house carpenter, and four boarders, one, Charles Edwards, 27, is Almira's cousin, listed as lumber dealer. Milton's family came to Morgan Co., IL abt 1831 and then to Greene County by 1833. He

m **Almira Adeline Edwards**⁹ 1 Jan 1851 in Greenfield, Greene, IL. Almira, dau of **David Stowell** and **Almira Adeline Wilcox Edwards**, was b 5 Mar 1831, Greenfield, IL.

William Tunnell was the s/o Calvin Tunnell and Jane Adair. Mary Jane Allen was dau of George Washington Allen (1801-1865) and Caroline Henderson (1808-1804).

- ii. **Albert Newton Williams**³ b 28 Mar 1857 IL; d 22 Sep 1942 Mobile, AL

Albert Newton Williams³ (*Milton*², *William*¹) b 28 Mar 1857 Greenfield, Greene, IL; d 22 Sept 1942 Mobile, AL. A. N. or 'Newt' as he was called, m **Eloise Callaway** 29 Dec 1881, Greenfield, IL. Eloise, dau of **Edwin H.** and **Matilda L. Matlock Callaway**, was b 3 Dec 1859 Greenfield; d 12 Feb 1944 Mobile, AL. She signed her name Elo or Ella. They are buried in Pine Crest Cemetery, Mobile, AL. Eloise and Minnie, her sister, married on the same date, 29 Dec 1881 in Greenfield. A. N., Eloise and their young son, Edwin Lee, came to Citronelle, AL before 1900. Excerpt taken from "All Roads Lead to Citronelle", January 24, 1902..... "A. N. Williams - Mr. A. N. Williams came here from Greenfield, IL and built a beautiful home. He is an architect, contractor and builder, and has to his credit some of the finest homes in and around Citronelle". 'Newt' worked for McPhillips Mfg. Company in Mobile and had an architectural firm with his son, Edwin Lee Williams.... Williams & Williams Architects - 65 or 68 St Francis Street, Mobile... in the early 1900's. They did the beautiful woodwork for the original Central Presbyterian Church in Mobile, of which they were members.

An 1880 Greenfield, IL census listed him as a 'house carpenter'; 1900 Citronelle, AL census 'carpenter'. Later census listed architect, builder.

Eloise and Newt had one son **Edwin Lee Williams**: b 1 Sept 1884 Greenfield, IL.

Edwin Lee Williams⁴ (*Albert Newton*³, *Milton*², *William*¹) b 1 Sept 1884; d 5 July 1917 Mobile, AL at the age of 33, after he contracted Typhoid Fever and died within two weeks. Bible records of Minnie listed him as Edwin Lea Williams, an old spelling of Lee. I assume he was named for his Grandfather, Edwin Henry Callaway, and the Lee possibly was the middle name of Eloise's mother Matilda L. Matlock. Lee Williams m **Emma Ethleen Riedemann** 31 June 1908, Chickasawbogue, Russell, AL. Ethleen, dau of **Henry and Emma J. Gertrude Harris Riedemann**, was b 18 Aug 1883 in Scotland, SD. Several years after Mother's father died,
